2012 Camporall Instructions

Registration:

Registration will begin at 5:00 PM there will be signage for the location of registration. You will need to provide a roster of all adults, scouts, and webelos in attendance. Please be prepared to pay all amounts due at that time. We will only accept checks. At registration you will be assigned colors that designate your patrols rotation. Please be prepared to tell registration how many patrols will be competing and the Patrol names. Remember WEBELOS cannot compete with Boy Scouts. Also, please indicate how many patrols will be competing in the utensiless cooking competition.

Games:

There will be four game rotations and there will be two rounds in each rotation. One for Boy Scouts and one for Webelos. Do not leave your rotation until signaled. Groups not competing should encourage those that are competing. Spirit is an overall factor.

5th Rotation:

After the 4th rotation is complete Boy Scouts should get their packs for the backpacking challenge and with their patrol report to the Nature Lodge for weighing. The backpacks are to be packed and ready to go. The packs will stay there until the Scouts return from lunch. The WEBELOS will begin their skill events at either Tomahawks, Blowguns, or Atlatl. They are to rotate through as indicated on the schedule based on their color. Boy Scouts not competing in the backpacking challenge are encourage to help the WEBELOS but will not be able to do the events.

Backpacking challenge:

This is a challenge where your patrol will have packed at a minimum the required items on the provided list. All packs will be weighed and the average weight for the patrol determined. (All items are to be in/attached to the pack including water, flashlights, knives, etc.) Packs are to be brought to the Nature lodge after the 4th rotation ready to go and be weighed. After lunch patrols are to return to the Nature lodge and will be given a series of directions sending them to remote parts of the camp where they will be challenged to complete various task using the equipment in their packs. Patrols not competing in this event will be given a minimum score when determining overall winner.

WEBELOS Activity Pins

There will be two sessions of activity pins. At 2:00 and 3:30. WEBELOS can choose where they want to attend. Readyman will be at handicraft, Naturalist will be at the old campfire ring, Outdoorsman will be at scout craft. Courses will be set up for Athlete in the parade field and can be done on their own.

Utensiless Cooking Competition

This will be a Patrol cooking competition. All materials will be given to you and this is what you will use to cook the item(s). You should bring work gloves or an oven mitt. This is open to both WEBELOS and Boy Scout patrols. This will be in front of the Dining Hall.

2012 Foothills Camporall – Backpacking Challenge

Troops will participate in the Backpacking Challenge in “patrols”. Each “patrol” team must consist of 4 or 6 Scouts. Each member of the team is required to have his own backpack, daypack or book bag for the challenge. Each Scout is expected to pack all of the 10 outdoor essentials as defined in the Boy Scout Handbook and will be awarded points for each of these items identified upon pack inspection at the beginning of the challenge.

10 Essentials:

1. Pocket Knife or Multi-tool
2. Personal First-Aid Kit
3. Extra Clothing (assume warm weather hiking)
4. Flashlight or Headlamp
5. Rain Gear
6. Water Bottle (FULL) ... A MUST have for participation!!
7. Compass
8. Matches & Fire Starter
9. Sun Protection
10. Trail Food

Every Scout is also expected to carry with him each of the following items throughout the duration of the challenge:

1. Map of Woodruff Scout Reservation (see attachment)
2. Sleeping Bag or Pad
3. Stave (Walking Stick)

In addition, every patrol team will be required to have each of the following items:

1. Water Filtration System
2. Backpacking Stove w/ Full Fuel Canister
3. Pot for Boiling Water
4. Tarp (Large enough to provide sleeping shelter for entire “patrol”)
5. 50ft Rope
6. Roll of Twine
7. Patrol First Aid Kit

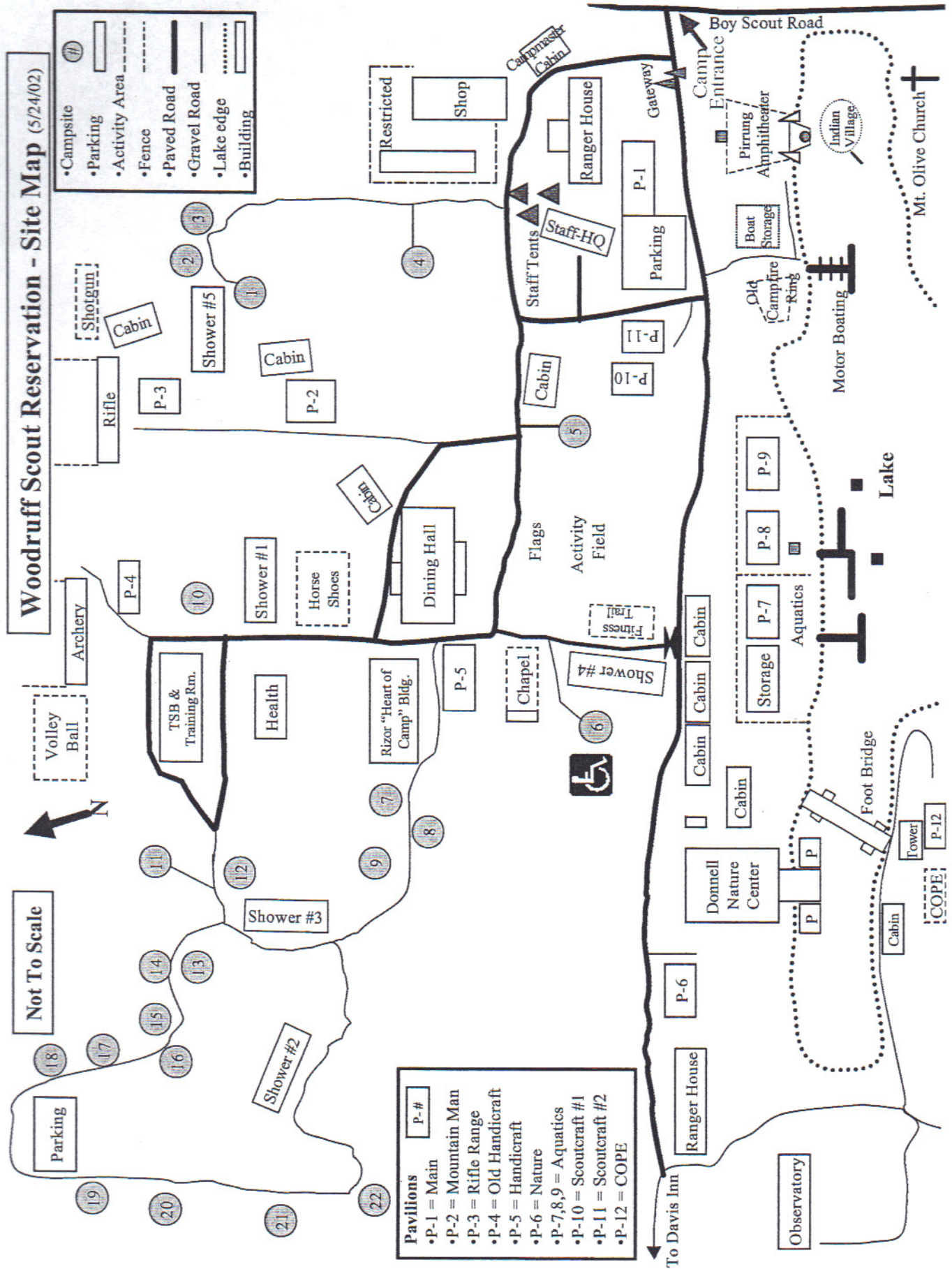
Hone up on your knots & lashings and your map & compass skills, bring your Scout Spirit, and come prepared for a rewarding “trail” experience!!

Serves 4~6

1. Bring 2 Nalgene's of water to a rolling boil.
2. Whisk in 1 Bear Creek Tortilla soup mix and bring to a boil, reduce heat and simmer for 10 minutes. Stirring occasionally.
3. Add in 2 packets of chicken and simmer for another 5 minutes. Stirring occasionally.
4. Place a handful of Frito chips in the bottom of your personal mess kit bowl and add soup on top. (Fritos in a can work best)

This is a spicy southwestern soup that is delicious and good for almost any occasion. It has been a family favorite for as long as I can remember.

Serves: 6-8 **Preparation time:** 10 min. **Cooking time:** 10 min.

Ingredients

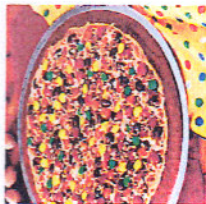
- 1 lb. hamburger meat
- 1 onion chopped
- 3 cans Texas Ranch Style Beans
- 2 cans Minestrone Soup concentrate
- 1 can Ro-Tel tomatoes
- 2 cans of water
- Tortilla Chips
- Cheese

Method

Brown hamburger meat with onions until no pink is left. Drain fat. Add the cans of beans/vegies and two soup cans of water. Heat until almost boiling.

Serve over chips topped with cheese.

Frosted Brownie Pizza



It's impossible to eat just one piece of this dessert pizza with a chewy, chocolatey crust, creamy peanut butter frosting and mouthwatering sweet and crunchy toppings. It's warmly received wherever I take it.

8-10 Servings **Prep:** 10 min. **Bake:** 15 min. + cooling

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup butter, cubed
- 2 ounces unsweetened [chocolate](#)
- 1 cup sugar
- 3/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
- **FROSTING:**
- 1 cup confectioners' sugar
- 1/3 cup creamy peanut butter
- 1-1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 2 to 4 tablespoons milk
- **TOPPINGS:**
- 3/4 cup plain M&M's
- 1/2 cup flaked coconut, toasted
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans, toasted

Directions

- In a small saucepan over low heat, melt the butter, chocolate and sugar. Remove from the heat; stir in flour until smooth. Add eggs and beat until smooth. Spread onto a greased foil lined 14" dutch oven.
- Bake at 350° (Place 16 briquettes on lid and 12 underneath) for 15 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Remove foil from dutch oven and cool completely.
- For frosting, in a bowl, beat the sugar, peanut butter, vanilla and enough milk to achieve desired spreading consistency. Spread over brownie crust. Top with M&M's, coconut and pecans. Yield: 8-10
- **For nut allergies, use canned chocolate or caramel frosting and top with sprinkles and M&M's
