- 1. Some people are not getting email. Ferrell and Ivy will get this fixed. This is limited to the Buffaloes and adults not registered with the troop.
- 2. Reflection of recent activities: Caving trip: good trip with positive feedback. Ropes course was good and was run by Eagle scouts.
