- 1. Survey filled out by parents as requested by the Atlanta Scout Executive.
- 2. Cathy Moland, Popcorn Chairman needs help. 1 volunteer to work at the distribution center from 6:30 to 9:00 to transfer the popcorn; 2 vehicles needed to bring popcorn to the church; one designated person to pick up patrol's popcorn. Pick up at 10am. She has done a great job and has kept our dues the same as last year.
