

## Patrol Leader's Council Meeting

November 29, 2004

1. PLC Meetings: Scouts need to wear full Class A or Class B uniforms.
2. Scoutmaster Comments, Attendance Reports and Officer and Patrol Leader Reports.
3. Mr. Moultrie wants a list from the Quarter Masters of the Patrols who have not turned in their action packers. This does not apply to the New Scout Patrols.
4. The Troop Guides played games with a visiting Cub Scout Pack and told them about our Troop..
5. The Trees are the new Patrol name for the Anacondas and the Cobras. They had 8 out of 10 Scouts come to their Patrol outing at the Braswell's house. They rolled scrolls for the upcoming Bethlehem Walk. They did Scouting for Food.
6. Pirates Report: They are planning the Holiday Party. Their outing was the Fire Station. 2 Scouts out of 8 came.
7. Raptors Report: Fire Station as their outing. 2 out of 6 came. 1 out of 6 has done Scouting for Food.
8. Flaming Falcons Report: Their outing was the Fire Station: 80% participation. Some Scouts participated in the Shooting weekend. Scouting for food.
9. Penguins Report: Scouting For Food 80% participation. Fire Station outing.
10. Dragons Report: Scouting For Food, 4 out of 8 Scouts have participated.
11. Roadrunners Report: Scouting For Food. Patrol outing- Fire Station.
12. Lightning Report: Patrol outing was Fire Station with 100% participation. Scouting For Food; 3 out of 9 have turned in cans..
13. Sea Base: Mr. Neas will get together with Scouts soon and will make a final decision on what the group wants to do.
14. Philmont Trip planned for 2006: 14 boys and 6 adults registered to go. 10 people per crew. First deposit due in January. Kenny Murray in charge.
15. John McFarland is in charge of the Scout National Jamboree July 25<sup>th</sup>. Minimum of 3 days camping, 5 day trip. Day hikes and canoeing. Cost will be camping, food, gas, and activities. Mr. McNealy will be helping with trip. Need Adult support. 5 Scouts have signed up.
16. If Patrol has 100% participation and meets the commitment of 50 cans per Scout, they may pass on outstanding Service Projects. Cans must be dropped off at Mr. Moultrie's house no later than Sunday. Leave message with Dr. Dineoff as to name, # of cans and Patrol name to get credit. Prizes are a MP# player and Hawk's tickets. Currently, the Troop is at 54% with the goal set by the Troop.
17. The reflection on October's Troop meetings was positive. Mr. Moultrie said that 3 out of 5 Scouts who had a Board of Review recently complained that the meetings were boring and not well planned. Also, no games. Patrols take planning the meetings seriously.
