Officer and Patrol Leader Reports:

1. Paul Nielson is going to get a roster organized with the new Scouts, their parent's name and their phone number.
2. Keith Neas turned in a list of Patrols who have not turned in their action packers.
3. Jonathan Egbert reported that there are 17 Scouts crossing over, 3 scouts visiting tonight and 5 crossovers scheduled.
4. Stephen Poole requested pictures from the Christmas party, the caving trip and the Yorktown trip.
5. Joseph Siebert working with Mr. McFarland to get the Merit Badge books up to date with the new requirements. They are waiting for the Canoeing MB books to come in.
6. Trees are working on a Scout program for the older Scouts and will have a calendar for Josh Franz in the next 2 weeks. They are doing a Service project next Sunday.
7. Pirates will be working on getting the Troop's sign back up in front of the Church.
8. Flaming Falcons: 9 Scouts went to the Klondike Derby. Some of the Patrol worked on the Engineering MB and some went to Scout Sunday. They are working on their Programs for March. They will elect a Patrol Leader next Monday.
9. Penguins: They participated in the Klondike Derby and won 2nd place in the highest flagpole. 7 of them participated in Scout Sunday. They are going to paint the shed's door.
10. Dragons: They have had 3 Patrol meetings and worked on their flag, cheer and their sled. 6 attended the Klondike derby and 6 went to Scout Sunday.
11. Road Runners: They have had 4 Patrol meetings and 6 attended Scout Sunday. They went to Lockheed and one went to Den Chief Training.
12. Lightning: They went to CiCi's Pizza and are starting to work on the program for May.
13. Sailing Trip is good to go with 2 spots open. Scouts must be in 8th grade. Philmont is a no for 2006. Mr. Neas will do a power point of the Northern Tier on Monday's meeting.

- 14.** Please bring all checked out gear to the Quartermasters next meeting. Keith will talk to Thijs about being at the meeting early to check in gear and Keith will be available right after the meeting.
- 15.** Pamela Roberts will be registering for Summer Camp tonight at midnight. 41 Scouts going and 8 adults. There are 2 open slots.
- 16.** Mr. McFarland will send an email out about Wednesday about the Kayak trip and what to bring. 2 groups: one tier- 10 Scouts and 4 or 5 adults. One tier- 8 Scouts and 4 adults.
- 17.** Mr. Murray is arranging the BP trip. Group A will do about 10 miles. Group B will do about 8 ½ miles. They need 1 ASM for Group B. The older Scouts need 1 more adult.
- 18.** 29 Scouts need training and 4 have signed up for Junior Leader Training March 26th. You must be trained to have a Troop Leader position.
- 19.** Patrol Campouts are May 6th-8th. If that weekend is not good for the Patrol, they must let the SPL know their definite plans for another weekend. Next PLC, Patrols must have their campout plans ready.
- 20.** Adult Leader Meeting has changed for this month to March 23rd.
- 21.** Spring Camporee: April 22nd-24th. Scouts who were eligible for O/A will be tapped out. If you are tapped out, you must attend either O/A Ordeal campout on May 13th-15th or May 20th-22nd.
- 22.** There will be a Cumberland Island sign-up sheet next meeting. They need an ASM for the trip. Scouts will be camping near the ferry Friday night.
- 23.** If interested in the Senior Patrol Leader or Assistant Senior Patrol Leader Position, you must let Mr. Moultrie know so you can get on the ballot. You must have experience as a Patrol Leader or an Assistant Patrol Leader. Green Bar Training strongly encouraged. You must be a Star Scout.
- 24.** May 21st: Swim checks at the Aquatics Base. Rainey Mountain allows us to get them done before Summer Camp.
- 25.** March 7th Meeting: We will have a special guest, Justin Thomas, Scout Executive.
- 26.** Court Of Honor for May: Cody Breitkreuz and Kyle Hughes have volunteered to be the Master of Ceremony. Jonathan Egbert and Stephen Poole have volunteered to be the MC's for the 1st night at Camporee.

- 27.** Marta Disaster Drill is April 3rd. at 2am. They are looking for 250-300 people to volunteer. This would be a way to meet requirement #7 for the Emergency Preparation MB.
- 28.** There will be a new system for checking in and checking out equipment. There will be new inventory sheet on 3 x 5 index cards. They will be labeling the backpacks and tents with metal tags. There are plans to put up shelves in the shed and hooks for hanging backpacks.
