First on the Agenda was Scouting For Food. This is very important being our largest community service. Our collection should be near 7,000 items. We currently have only 200-300 items collected. Please get with your patrol and collect more items. There are three plans that commonly work successfully.

- 1. Face to face, or door to door. Best done with a driver in the street while the boys go two by two to the doors asking for dry good for MUST then placing the items in the vehicle. The scouts are not to go into houses, not cut through yards. Please do walk up the driveway / walkway and be polite while wearing your class B. Scouts do not have to go through their own neighborhoods. They may even choose to go through nearby Fulton or Canton. For example, in the past, neighborhoods near Shallowford Rd. and McFerson Rd. have been generous.
- 2. Leave bags with a note left <u>outside</u> the mailbox or at the house. Then make collection at specified time on note.
- 3. Set up and attend a collection booth outside Kroger, etc. asking for "donations on the way out".

Out target goal is 50 cans per scout. To be turned in no later than December 1, 2004. To turn in your count please fill out a 3 X 5 card with:

- 1. Patrol Name
- 2. Scout Name
- 3. Quantity collected

and then given to the patrol leader, who then gives it to Mr. Dinott. A poster will be at PLC next Monday. Mr. McFarland will inform the Dragons, Lightning and Anacondas. (no other representation for those patrols at this meeting)
