- 3. April 30<sup>th</sup>: District Summer Camp Physicals; 8am –12pm. First come first serve.
- 4. April 15<sup>th</sup>-17<sup>th</sup>: New Scout Campout for New Scouts and their parents. We need 2 adults to teach wood yard and one adult to be there all weekend. Tour permit is in progress. Tenting buddies will be decided at the April 11<sup>th</sup> meeting.
- 5. Medical forms are in the Red book. Scouts and parents should read the book together as there is loads of valuable information inside.
- 6. Troop Jr. Leader Training is this Saturday (3/26). Den Chief Training is available 3 times a year.
- 7. Adult Training is finished, but will be offered later in the spring and the fall.
- 8. Sailing Trip (May 28<sup>th</sup>-June 1<sup>st</sup>) Crew meeting tomorrow. There are 2 more open spots for Scouts who are interested.
- 9. Shenandoah Valley Backpacking: 107 miles. 10 Scouts signed up. New Scout parents, encourage your son to try one backpacking trip to see if he likes it. Troop has several opportunities a year for a check out trip.
