

1. NYLT: 5 recommendations for scouts.
2. Elections and new troops structure: Thrashers joined the Penguin patrol. Mr. Poole is the leading ASM with Cindy, Robin, and Mark assisting ASMs. The patrol needs to decide on their patch. Peter can ask Mrs. Scherer about custom patch. If the patrol decides to change their name, they must talk to the SPL and the scoutmaster for approval. Other feedback: it was hard to hold the scouts in the room when they were finished. The troop is done when everyone is done. Overall, elections went well. Rearrangement of officers must be done by the June 3rd meeting. It was suggested that Jeffrey Andersen, quartermaster being swapped for a troop guide position. It is up to the SPL.
3. First aid and Aquatics Merit Badge Weekend: June 20th -22nd. Not all of the patrol has signed up. Mrs. Roberts is working on the staff. Dennis Rowe has committed to cooking for the weekend. We need older scouts for the cook crew. Chuck Oliver will do the safe swim checks. There is a sign-up sheet for meals and who will be attending. The SPL will be there Saturday morning. Pamela Roberts is the ASM in charge. We need a scout in charge for Friday night. The Fighting Frogs Patrol will split into two food groups and work on their second class cooking requirements. They will need an action packer. We need a driver list. Dietmar volunteered to pull the trailer. We need ASM support for scouts doing the aquatics merit badges. Nick Law and a buddy need to get approval from the SPL, Caron Frazier and Scott Anderson for the campfire program that weekend.
4. There is a new Tour Permit on the national website.
5. Summer camp: July 7th -12th. 44 scouts and 17 ½ adults are going. 15 adults are going the full week. Mr. Blevins is the scoutmaster in charge. The SPL and Bradley Jacquet are also going. Mr. Blevins should talk to Kenny Murray about summer camp notes he took when he was scoutmaster last year. The first meeting in June is an important summer camp meeting. All parents whose scouts are going to summer camp should be at the meeting. There will be 14 scouts in the new scout program.
6. Annual planning process and: SPL needs to think about survey for input from the scouts about activities for next year and meet with the scoutmaster. Mr. Murray will be leading the cook team for the planning Campout.
7. Adult planning meeting is August 9th. 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM. SPL is invited. The troop is taken apart and put back together. Mr. Moultrie and Mr. Watkins will be present. Mr. Watkins is the committee chairperson. The meeting may be structured a little differently this year. There will be pizza after the meeting, followed by CPR for those who need training. This will be taught by Mr. England for a fee of \$6.00. You may practice your skills if you wish.
8. Jacqui Hunt is the popcorn chair for next year.

9. There is a service project at Kennesaw Mt. helping to clean up trails if scouts are interested. This will work for a service project for patrols that need a project outside the church service project.
10. Memorial Day Flag Placement: May 24th. Noelle Gregg is the adult in charge and Stephen Poole is the scout in charge.
11. There are no changes to the guide for safe scouting. Permission slips should be notarized when scouts are going out of state. It was discussed about having one permission slip to treat medically notarized and would travel with the medical forms. We would have a separate permission slip for permission to go on the trip. The June roundtable will discuss liability. Laser tag is not scout appropriate, and paint ball is only appropriate if shooting at targets and not scouts.
12. Memorial Day and July 7th: there will be no troop meeting.
13. Sea Base: May 31st –June 8th. 19 scouts and adults going.
14. June 9th: troop outings by patrol.
15. June 12th: roundtable. Tour permits and liability will be discussed. Roswell Street Baptist church. Hosting Covered Bridge District.
16. June 24th: Adult leader meeting. Scott Anderson will be the acting scoutmaster as Mr. Moultrie will be away.
17. June 27th-28th: Mill Springs Lock-in. SPL should make sure there are appropriate video games being played. Scouts will have access to the gym, tennis courts, and playing fields. The Astronomy Club may be there again this year. We need an adult in charge.
18. BSA & ARC lifeguard training: July 18th-20th and July 25th-27th. Probably will be at Bert Adams. Mr. Moultrie and daughter Katherine participating and can provide car pool logistics for others wanting to participate.
19. SPL needs to work on summer lunch program in June.
20. Raccoon MT: August 2nd-3rd. Mr. Moultrie and Mr. England will be going. Fun trip. We need adults from the Fighting Frog patrol to go since the Fighting Frogs will be likely ones to sign up for this trip.
