- Camporee Colleen Breaugh volunteered to drive on Friday so there would be enough drivers to transport all the Participants. Seven Scouts and 2 adults have been selected to be tapped out for OA. They will be recognized at the first regular meeting after the Camporee. There will be an Iron Chef Cookoff and chariot races. The Troop will decide on which country to represent in the Olympics.
- Mill Springs Lock-In in June Will need a minimum of 4 adults present at all times or the event will not happen. Adults may switch off during the night so long as the minimum number of adult supervisors is maintained.
- Summer Camp Deadline for registration to the Troop via website was Monday, March 23rd. Most Scouts have registered and contact will be made with the remainder of Scouts who signed up by the end of this week. Mrs. Moultrie will pass along the information of the new Scouts to Mrs. Hunt so they can be registered as well. Next payment is due April 20th and all forms other than the registration is due June 1st at the Summer Camp Information Troop meeting.
- Green Bar Recommendation letters have been submitted for 4 or 5 Scouts thus far. The opportunity for more Scouts to sign up still exists.
- Personal Safety Video The Anti-bullying and Internet Safety videos will be presented on April 20th with Jerry Richstein and Scott Anderson proctoring the video scripts. However, if April 13th is foul weather and the flag retirement ceremony can not take place, the videos will be shown then and the flag ceremony will be on the 20th. Discussion about the new Scouts possibly missing the videos if they are presented on the 13th resulted in a decision that the new Scouts would be shown the videos in their own patrol at a later time if needed.
