Leadership-Building Programs

CUB SCOUTS There are 20,575 boys taking part in this year-round family program. Promoting character, citizenship training, and physical fitness through challenging yet fun activities is the goal. Plus, Scouts learn honesty, bravery, and respect through peer groups and parental guidance.

BOY SCOUTS Character. Citizenship. Leadership skills. Fitness. Boy Scouts develop these attributes, and others, through outdoor adventure activities. Currently, there are 9,170 boys in this program which is designed to transform a boy into a well-rounded man.

VENTURING Designed for both young men and women, this program teaches leadership to the 1,125 participating youths through outdoor activities.

EXPLORING This coed, work-site-based program helps Explorers pursue their career interests as well as gain leadership skills. There are 1,260 participants in this program.

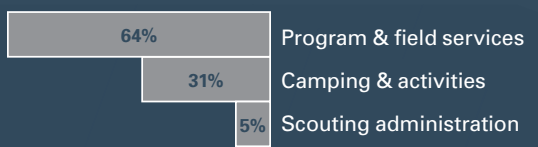

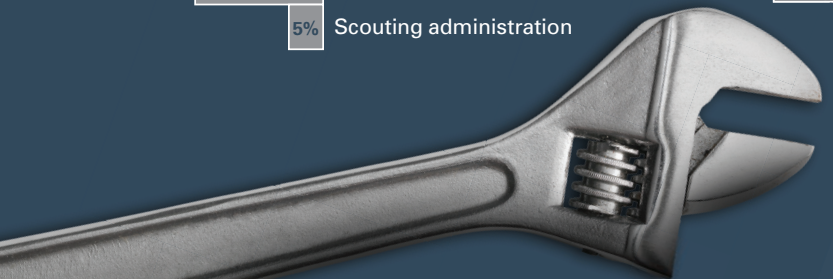
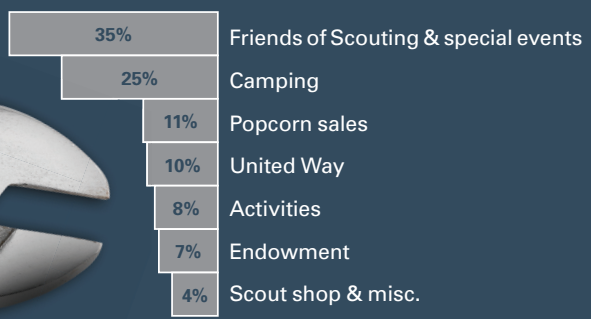
