# Your Way to Help Troop 714 and the Atlanta Area Council

Every year, a collective groan is heard from parents and scouts when the popcorn season approaches. Boys, parents, and leaders alike all dread the oncoming storm of order forms, boxes of popcorn, and desperate pleas from the popcorn kernel. Many have asked: can we sell something else? Can we just not do THIS fundraiser? I am afraid, we cannot change the sale, but I want you to know why and what Troop 714 has done to make it better.

Popcorn is the one fundraiser each year that benefits both the Troop and the Atlanta Area Council. Troop 714 uses the money raised in popcorn sales each year to cover all of its annual overhead costs and equipment costs. When we buy new tents, propane tanks, charcoal, dutch ovens, and other equipment, we use popcorn money. When we pay for visiting Webelos to eat on the camperall, we use popcorn money. When we need to do repairs or pay taxes on the trailers, we use popcorn money. All profits from other fundraisers throughout the year go directly to the scout. Popcorn sales are the only source of income for Troop 714.

In years past, many parents have complained about the Popcorn sale process. They have been frustrated by the significant time gap between taking orders and delivery. Troop 714 has helped by making the popcorn available for pickup throughout the sale. You are welcome, at any time, to contact Lisa DiStanza for popcorn. She can help you immediately fill your orders with popcorn she is storing in her garage. You can contact her at **Akeila.den1@yahoo.com**. You can also pick up popcorn at troop meetings.

All scouts will need to turn in final orders by the October 8th meeting. After that time, we will only be able to sell what we have in storage, and will not be able to order any additional popcorn from council. Sales will continue through the month of November, but after October, we will no longer be able to order additional popcorn. All money and forms must be turned in at the November 19th meeting. You will be responsible to pay for any popcorn you have in your home at that time.

Important Dates to Remember:

October 8 - turn in orders for popcorn (can continue to sell what is in stock). November 19th - must have ALL sales completed and ALL money turned in. Thanks for all your help.
