

Equipment List

	Rain Gear: preferably no ponchos. Cheap PVC rain suit is better
	Tent (2 man) each boy must have a tent buddy. Adults do not have to buddy up. (Troop Tents are available.)
	Sleeping Bag
	Ground Cloth
	Pillow (optional)
	Water Bottle
	Small first aid kit
	Flash Light (head lamps preferred)
	Chair
	Mess Kit = a plate or bowl silverware is sufficient. No need to buy a brand new mess kit
	Pocket Knife (we will collect these from each New Scout before leaving for the campout. They will be retuned once the New Scout Have earned their Totin' Chip.
Clothing:	
	Class A = to be worn to and from the campout
	Fleece Sweatshirt or Jacket
	2 Class B Shirts (any scout/cub scout shirt will do) preferably non cotton.
	Shorts
	3 pair socks
	2 pair underwear
	Pair of boots or well tread sneakers. No open toed shoes allowed.

All gear will be going in the Troop trailer.

The Troop will bring the food & cook gear.

We want this weekend to be successful. Try not to stress. As your son goes to more camp outs and develops an interest in other outdoor overnight events, you can add things. For now, just these basics will be fine.

Please Remember

This weekend, you will have a lot to do and will need to focus on your own adult patrol. The boys will be close by but not camping with you. They will be focusing on their own patrol and learning from experienced well-trained adults and older scouts.
