# **Activity Planning:**

T-714 – Star, Life, Eagle rank requirement #1: "Active" participation

It's been a while since this was published so here's a refresher on requirement #1 for the advanced ranks: To be "active" in the troop and your patrol. Successful completion of this requirement obviously requires the Scout to be "registered" and in good standing. Beyond that however, the fact that the requirement says "be active" and not just "be registered", indicates that there is more expected. BSA National says that we should make "reasonable expectations" regarding these requirements. For T-714, our long-standing policy for "active" presumes an active Scout will meet all of the following three standards:

- 1. Attending at least 1/2 the troop meetings in a month counts that month toward the four (Star) or six (Life/Eagle) month requirement.
- 2. Camping at the troop level for at least 1/2 of the required number of months (i.e., two campouts for Star, three each for Life and Eagle).
- 3. Participating fully in patrol events including Program Patrol, Service Patrol, service projects (for MVUMC, Scouting for Food, other).

If a Scout has concerns about his ability to meet any of these three standards, he should request to meet with the Scoutmaster <u>in advance</u> to discuss alternative ways in which he can demonstrate clearly that he is "active" in the Scouting program. Waiting until a Scout is otherwise ready to advance to consider this requirement does not meet the leadership and personal responsibility standards expected of a Scout wanting to attain the advanced ranks of Star, Life and Eagle.
